“For the things we have to learn before we can do them, we learn by doing them”.

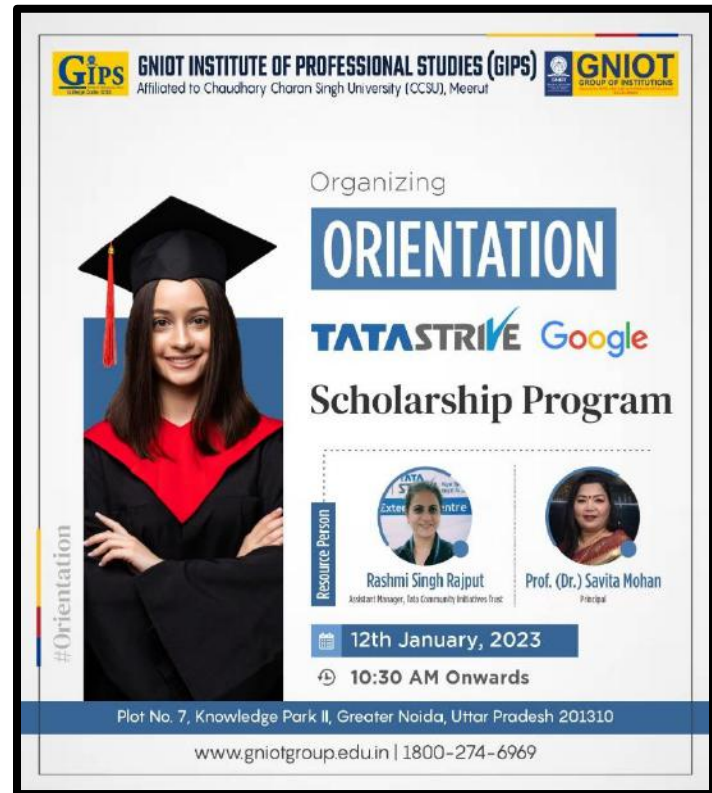

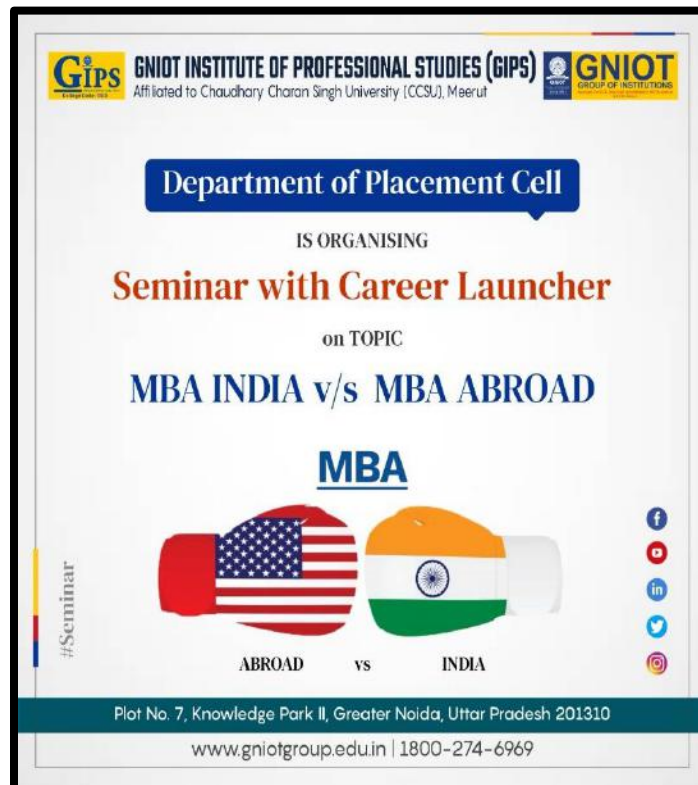

Webinar on Formulation on Research Objectives & Data Collection (Jan. 18, 2023)

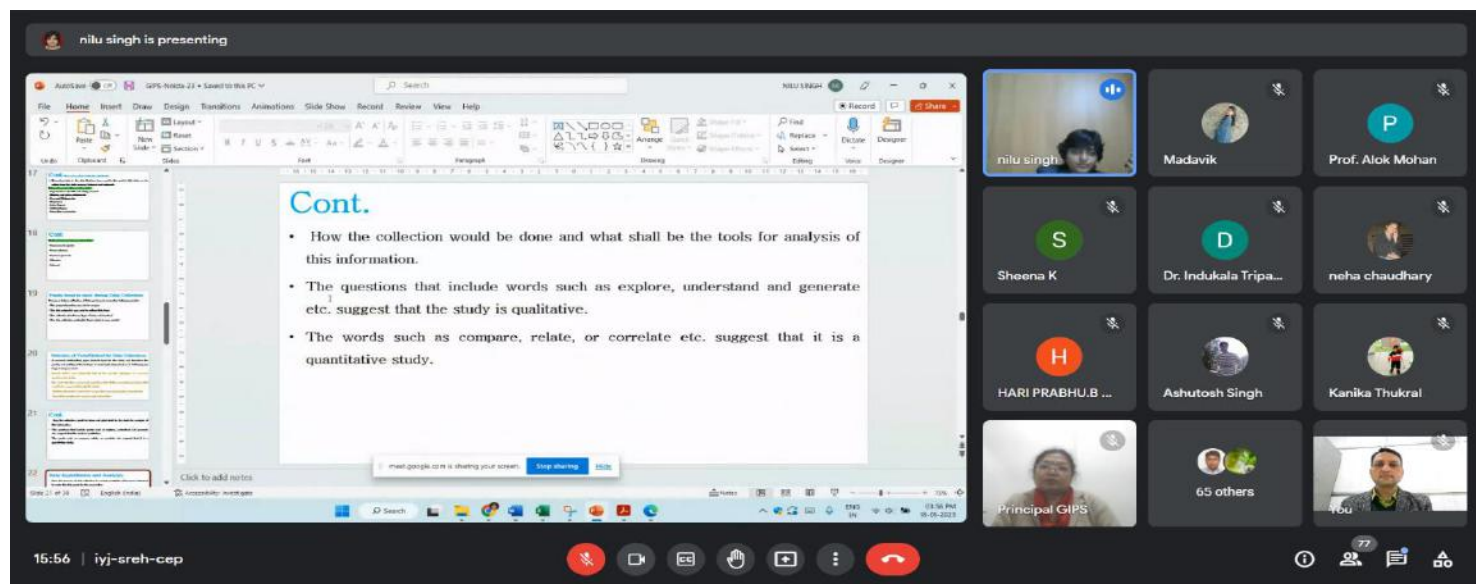
“I believe in innovation and that the way you get innovation is to fund research and learn the basic facts.”

GNIOT - IPS, Greater Noida organized a Webinar on “Formulation of Research Objectives and Data Collection Methods” under the banner of INQUEST-The Research and Development Club.

The speaker of the session was Dr. Nilu Singh (Associate Professor, Department of Computer Science & Engineering, Lakshmaiah Education Foundation, Guntur, A.P) She focused on the Research aim, Research objectives, the type of data that you will collect, and the methods and procedures you will use to collect, store, and process the data. She further emphasized the fact to test a hypothesis, measuring something precisely, gaining large-scale statistical insights, and collect quantitative data.

If your aim is to explore ideas, understand experiences, or gain detailed insights into a specific context, collect qualitative data.

If you have several aims, you can use a mixed methods approach that collects both types of data. She discussed some common mistakes in the formulation of research aiming to relate the following like choosing the topic too broadly, another one is setting an unrealistic aim, etc. In this context, further ideas were refined by Prof. Dr. Savita Mohan, Principal (GNIOT-IPS). She focused on data collection, its benefits, the difference between qualitative and quantitative methods of data collection, and much more. The event was well organized by INQUEST-The Research and Development Club. Total 128 students registered for the activity The activity was coordinated by the members of the R&D Club.

Food Insecurity



Food insecurity is one of the world's greatest challenges, and extreme weather poses a huge risk to the food system. How technology is helping them?

According to a UN report on the State of Food Security and Nutrition in the World, 811 million people in the world went

hungry in 2020. The same report estimates that 118 million people in the world suffer from chronic hunger.

A billion people on the planet go hungry every night and don't have enough nutrition. The average smallholder farmer is four hectares. The farmer produces crops mainly to feed their family (surrounding and extended). They consume about 80% of what they produce.

According to the FAO, globally, the number of people facing severe food insecurity rose by 60 million between 2014 and 2019. The organization estimates that nearly 750 million people are struggling with severe levels of food insecurity, representing nearly 10 percent of the world's population.

Extreme weather poses a huge risk to the food system. Droughts and floods affecting multiple major grain-producing "breadbaskets" simultaneously were once considered an unlikely scenario until the second half of the century, but now climate scientists fear this may only be a year or two away.

Extreme weather risks the collapse of the \$8 trillion global-food system.

The pandemic has led to unprecedented labor shortages in the food and agricultural sector. That's causing widespread supply-chain disruption, adding to crop losses from weather extremes and contributing to shortages and rising prices. Shipping prices between Asia and the US have soared 500% compared to a year ago.

For the first time, industries including food processing,

consumer-goods manufacturing, and life sciences logged a larger increase in robotics orders for all of 2020 than automakers, which have historically been the largest purchasers of robotic systems.

Food and agriculture account for one-quarter of all carbon emissions, with animal products as the largest contributor. Precision fermentation and cell-based food can replace meat, dairy, eggs, and other animal products at a lower cost within the next 10 years. By 2035, this could eliminate billions of tons of emissions and free up 2.7 billion hectares of land — an area the size of the United States, China, and Australia combined, according to the Rethink X report. Allowing this land to regenerate can offset 10% of global emissions; reforest some of it and 20% of emissions could be offset. There would also be tremendous improvements in biodiversity and opportunities for recreation.

Today plant-based meats are a fixture at fast-food restaurants and plant-based milk is a household staple. Also, it is expected alternative-protein market could reach 22% in 2035 with sufficient investment and regulatory assistance. Climate change, food security, health concerns, and rising ESG investments are powering the shift to alternative proteins.

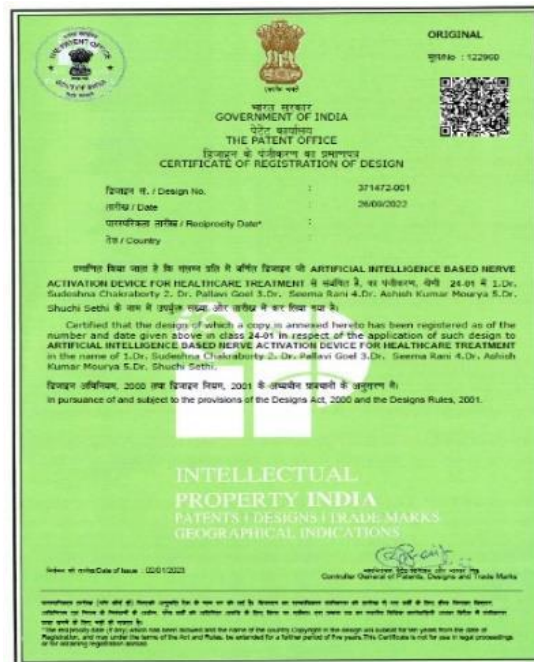

Global Warming

Impact of Greenhouse Gases

The rise in carbon dioxide levels (CO₂) leads to a substantial increase in temperature. It is because CO₂ remains concentrated in the atmosphere for even hundreds of years. Due to activities like fossil fuel combustion for electricity generation, transportation, and heating, human beings have contributed to the increase in the CO₂ concentration in the atmosphere.

Global Warming: A Gradual Phenomenon

Recent years have been unusually warm, causing worldwide concern. But the fact is that the increase in carbon dioxide actually began in 1800, due to the deforestation of a large chunk of North-eastern America, besides forested parts of the world. In the wake of the industrial revolution, things worsened with emissions, leading to an increase in carbon dioxide levels by 1900.

Cause of Concern

According to the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), global temperature is likely to rise by about 1-3.5 Celsius by the year 2100. It has also been suggested that the climate might warm by as much as 10 degrees Fahrenheit over the next 100 years.

Impact of Global Warming

The sea levels are constantly rising as freshwater marshlands, low-lying cities, and islands have been inundated with seawater. There have been changes in rainfall patterns, leading to droughts and fires in some areas, and flooding in other areas. Ice caps are constantly

melting posing a threat to polar bears as their feeding season stands reduced. Glaciers are gradually melting. Animal populations are gradually vanishing as there has been a widespread loss of their habitat.

Conclusion

As per the Kyoto protocol, developed countries are required to cut back their emissions. There is a need to reduce coal-fired electricity, increase energy efficiency through wind and solar power, and also the high-efficiency natural gas generation.
